## **Fancy something to eat!?**

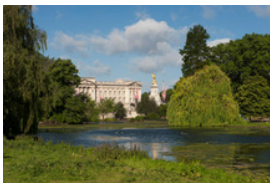
Well, don't worry I got you covered.
